Discovery Charter School Board Meeting June 21, 2023

- I. Call to order and roll call
  - Lisa Gonzalez, Kelly Hunt Vander Vliet, Suzanne Radzick, Lori Knox Lindsey, Miranda Wilkening. Mylese Tucker joined via phone. Tiana Clark, Ryan Schoffelmeer and Jessica Lynch not present. Discovery – Ernesto Marinez and Debra Weller Gabrielle Group – Allen Gabrielle
- II. Mission and Vision read by Suzanne Radzick
- III. Nothing informational to report.
- IV. Financial Report
  - Cash increase due to ERTC funds, one of four which will be received. Some capital expenditures from lighting outside.
  - Without ERTC would have been at 20k deficit for the month but YTD up without ERTC about 120k, so in a good position in general and ERTC helped as well. We will receive 2 more ERTC payments next fiscal year.
  - Looking at putting the ERTC money into a capital fund to reserve the funds and put towards expansion etc. so it is not figured into the budget as of yet.
  - Updated budget and payroll all in good position for next year, will be finalized as we get final numbers for next school year. Suzanne motioned to approve the 2023-24 Budget pending changes discussed. Lori seconded. Unanimously passed.
- V. Consent Agenda
  - Lisa motioned to approve the consent agenda and Suzanne seconded.

  - Strategic Planning Session will resume again in August, date tbd.
  - -Annual Report Will send out the middle of July, will add a few more financial numbers

- -Executive Director onboarding going well. Both will start officially July 1st. Have been meeting with Ernesto who's last day is Friday, but will be available as needed.
- -Board Self Assessment will resume in August
- Culture of Care Policy is it enforceable? Needs to be looked at again.
- -Professional Standards Policy introducing the idea of putting professional standards in place (a Code of Conduct) so everything is clear with social media, language, parental interactions, communication etc. Will vote next meeting to put in staff handbook.
- -ERTC finance group met and discussed how to use the money, using for operations isn't sustainable. Looking at the bonds, the long term plan etc and the best way to keep the liquidity while having them in a series of incremental CDs. Will be kept separately from the regular funds.
- -Staff Handbook discussed changes to dress code and clearly specifying when vacation kicks in. No changes to staff dress code at this time but it is something he is looking at. Lisa motioned to approve. Lori seconded. Approved unanimously.
- -Counselor/SPED Greg discussed changing hiring a social worker/counselor to putting in a lead SPED teacher/coordinator. Job will be posted soon.
- -Movie Night Possible date August 11th, Frozen
- -Summer planning days for staff hold off until Vera further develops curriculum

Matters of Approval

- 1. Nicotine Free Campus Policy Suzanne made a motion, Lori seconded, unanimously passed.
- 2. Budget discussed earlier
- 3. Outdoor signage lighting is complicated due to power issues and going to cost more than we want to pay (22k quote) Lisa

motioned to approve paying Landmark for the signage without lighting. Miranda seconded, unanimously approved.

- 4. Math Curriculum Originally settled on Envision but Vera gave an overview of IReady and why she recommends it. It flags what problems kids have and gets kids the Ready Math program that they specifically need etc. It has a lot of dynamic features including programs that can be done at home and she has seen it work before. It would do away with STAR testing. She got a quote that also includes Ready Reading (36k with both programs plus PD, opposed to 31k for Envision). Lisa motioned to approve the switching curriculums, Lori seconded. Passed Unanimously.
- 5. Discipline Policy Positive behavior wording was questioned, Greg said it was in the planning stages.
- 6. Uniform Policy Change in policy included any color or pattern pants as long as they fit properly, skorts (shorts will be allowed ending at three fingers or less above the knee) and any hoodie/ sweatshirts must be Discovery wear. Board stressed it needs to be enforceable re: outerwear (hoodies, zip ups etc). Suzanne made a motion, Lisa seconded–all approved.
- \*\*\*\*\*(At this point Greg jumped in and went through all his changes in the student handbook. Those not included on the itinerary below included: Opening the gym doors on 8/22 at 7:30. Cell Phone policy-removing language re taking away phones, added re no phones UNLESS directed/allowed by staff. Removal of taking away toys. Change holidays to celebrations, removal of one hour language re parties. Language re Pink Eye as it is no longer recommended students stay home. Removal of language regarding school books. Added link to Raptor. Removal of all COVID language. Change of grade policy re clubs/sports to ineligibility based on an F on the quarterly report card as checking each week is too challenging. Board asked if language could be added to give coach discretion and admin will discuss and come back. Improper use of technology policy

discussed, removing three month penalty-tbd after admin further reviews. )
